SECRETARY'S MESSAGE

Dear Devotees and Members,

As this edition goes to press, I write what will, in all likelihood, be my final message as Secretary of the Kali Mandir Society for the 2024–2026 term. It is therefore both a privilege and an emotional moment to place before you one last account of our activities and to express my heartfelt gratitude for the affection, encouragement and unwavering support that I have received from our members throughout this journey.

The month of June was unlike any other in recent memory. As the Society prepared for its biennial elections, Chittaranjan Park and its surrounding areas witnessed an atmosphere of remarkable enthusiasm and democratic participation. For weeks, members of different panels and independent candidates campaigned vigorously and passionately, reaching out to voters through meetings, personal interactions and digital platforms. The entire community was infused with an unmistakable spirit of participation, reflecting the deep sense of ownership that our members feel towards the Kali Mandir Society.

The election to the Managing Committee was held on 5 July 2026. Strictly speaking, the coverage of this event belongs to the July issue of the Newsletter. However, considering its importance in the life of our Society, we have chosen to report it in this edition itself. Should the final results be declared before this Newsletter goes to press, they will be carried as a Breaking News feature in these pages, ensuring that our readers receive the outcome without delay.

One of the most gratifying aspects of this election was the smooth and efficient polling process. Learning from the experience of previous elections, where voters often had to wait for two to three hours before casting their votes, the outgoing Managing Committee introduced four polling stations instead of the single polling station traditionally used. This significantly distributed the voter load and enabled polling to proceed with remarkable efficiency.

Our objective was simple—to ensure that every voter could enter the polling area, cast his or her vote and leave

within thirty minutes. We are delighted that this objective was comfortably achieved, with the average turnaround time being approximately fifteen minutes. For many members, accustomed to the long queues of earlier years, this came as a pleasant surprise and was widely appreciated. The orderly arrangements, combined with the wholehearted cooperation of our members, candidates, polling personnel and volunteers, ensured that the election was conducted peacefully, efficiently and in a truly democratic spirit.

Every election, by its very nature, brings with it spirited debate, strong convictions and, at times, a measure of acrimony. This election was no exception. While differing viewpoints are an integral part of any healthy democratic process, it is equally important to remember that elections are but a means to an end—not an end in themselves. The election is now behind us, and the time has come for us to look ahead.

Whatever the outcome, we are, first and foremost, members of one Kali Mandir family, united by our shared devotion to the Divine Mother and our common commitment to the welfare of this Society. I therefore earnestly appeal to every member to put aside the differences that may have arisen during the campaign, renew old friendships, extend goodwill to one another and work together in a spirit of civility, cooperation and mutual respect. If this election ultimately strengthens our unity and reinforces the bonds that have always defined our community, it will have achieved its highest purpose. I sincerely hope and pray that this is the path we shall collectively choose.

As I conclude my tenure as Secretary, I do so with immense satisfaction and gratitude. The past two years have been a period of significant activity, growth and achievement for our Society. Together, we have celebrated our festivals with devotion, expanded our membership, strengthened our infrastructure, introduced new initiatives, enhanced our cultural and social outreach, and worked continuously to preserve the traditions and values that make our Mandir such a special institution.

None of these accomplishments would have been possible without the collective efforts of countless

individuals. I express my sincere gratitude to our President and fellow members of the Managing Committee, our priests and staff, our dedicated volunteers, the convenors and members of our various committees, our generous donors and sponsors, and above all, every member and devotee whose trust, cooperation and constructive suggestions have guided us throughout our tenure.

Serving as your Secretary has been one of the greatest honours of my life. The affection, goodwill and encouragement that I have received from the members of this Society will remain among my most cherished memories. While responsibilities may change with time, my commitment to the Kali Mandir Society and to the ideals that it represents will remain unchanged. I shall continue to serve this institution in whatever capacity I can, always with the same devotion and sincerity.

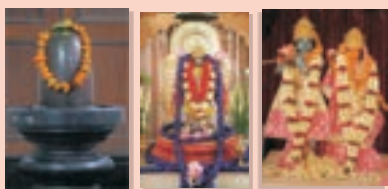
